- **Course Framework:** The TTEAR Engine (Teach, Train, Equip, Activate, Release)

Course Description

This course provides a comprehensive framework for transitioning believers into highly disciplined, self-governing Kingdom ambassadors. Designed specifically for online delivery with local, hands-on deployment, it bridges systematic biblical architecture with strategic marketplace and community engagement. Students will build the structural integrity needed to run decentralised ministries, map territorial needs, and manifest the tangible presence of the Kingdom across diverse fields.

Core Learning Outcomes

By the conclusion of this course, students will be able to:

1. **Apply** the TTEAR process to personal spiritual disciplines and leadership development.

2. **Conduct** a thorough territorial and demographic mapping exercise of a local community.
3. **Execute** a strategic, compassion-driven marketplace or community field initiative.
4. **Govern and scale** decentralised cell structures using sound institutional principles.

Weekly Core Curriculum

Module 1: The Foundations of Kingdom Discipleship

Week 1: The Call and Costs of Discipleship

- **Focus:** Shifting mindsets from casual church membership to total surrender to King and Kingdom.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Luke 9:23–26, Matthew 28:18–20.
- **Core Concepts:** The anatomy of a disciple; understanding the TTEAR process; dismantling consumer-driven theology.
- **Field Practicum:** *The Personal Inventory*. Identify three areas of self-interest currently competing with Kingdom alignment. Draft a personal 90-day covenant of discipline.

Week 2: The Inner Chambers & Spiritual Architecture

- **Focus:** Building private structural integrity to sustain public power and longevity.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Matthew 6:6, Galatians 5:16–26.
- **Core Concepts:** Cultivating the hidden life; character development vs. charismatic gifting; breaking the self-life in a digital age.
- **Field Practicum:** *The Accountability Circle*. Form a virtual triad with two peers; establish a weekly digital checkpoint tracking prayer, study, and character goals.

Module 2: Strategic Field Ministry & Marketplace Deployment

Week 3: Territorial Mapping & Demographic Discernment

- **Focus:** Analysing the spiritual, cultural, and socio-economic realities of a target geography.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Numbers 13:17–20, Nehemiah 2:11–17.
- **Core Concepts:** Structural evaluation of strongholds; identifying physical and emotional community deficits; data-driven strategy for field entry.

- **Field Practicum:** *Community Profile*. Submit a 1-page profile of your local city or neighbourhood detailing its primary industry, key demographics, and top two social vulnerabilities.

Week 4: Marketplace Ministry & Civic Diplomacy

- **Focus:** Operating effectively as an authorised representative of the Kingdom within secular and professional systems.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Daniel 6:1–4, Genesis 41:38–41.
- **Core Concepts:** Secular vs. sacred dichotomy shattered; corporate governance as spiritual stewardship; the modern marketplace as the primary harvest field.
- **Field Practicum:** *Marketplace Assessment*. Identify how your current career path or professional skill set can serve as a conduit for systemic ethical or spiritual restoration.

Module 3: Evidential Power & Compassion in the Field

Week 5: Compassion-Driven Frontline Evangelism

- **Focus:** Translating theological knowledge into targeted acts of service for vulnerable populations.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Isaiah 58:6–12, Matthew 25:34–40.
- **Core Concepts:** Meeting physical needs as a prerequisite to spiritual engagement; the infrastructure of mercy; structural integrity in welfare.
- **Field Practicum:** *Field Service Assignment*. Complete 3 hours of documented community service or outreach (e.g., local soup kitchen, elderly visitation, or neighbourhood cleanup). Submit a brief reflective summary.

Week 6: Signs, Wonders, and Territorial Engagement

- **Focus:** Combining operational discipline with the supernatural manifestation of the Spirit on the frontlines.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Mark 16:15–20, Luke 10:1–19.
- **Core Concepts:** The theology of evidential power; ministering healing and deliverance; maintaining personal safety and spiritual authority.
- **Field Practicum:** *Active Engagement*. Pray with at least two individuals outside your immediate family or church circle. Log their responses and your internal observations.

Module 4: Structural Multiplication & Global Release

Week 7: Sovereign Governance in Decentralised Cell Networks

- **Focus:** Designing and stewarding small, scalable home or workplace fellowship cells.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Acts 2:42–47, Exodus 18:17–23.
- **Core Concepts:** The Jethro system of leadership; managing decentralised networks without losing doctrinal or vision alignment; building sustainable micro-churches.
- **Field Practicum:** *Cell Blueprint*. Create a 1-page operational guide for a weekly 45-minute home or workplace fellowship, detailing the hospitality, teaching, and safety protocol.

Week 8: Commissioning & Strategic Global Partnerships

- **Focus:** Launching out with institutional backing, accountability, and a long-term strategic map.
- **Scripture Foundations:** Acts 13:1–3, Ecclesiastes 4:9–12.
- **Core Concepts:** Understanding Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) structures; ecosystem thinking in the Global Body; moving from local operation to global impact.
- **Field Practicum:** *Capstone Project Submission*. Present a fully executable, written 90-day Field Ministry Launch Plan.

Weekly Instructional Delivery Rhythm

1. Synchronous Masterclass: 90 Mins | Monday Evening.

Live virtual lecture focusing on theological foundations, governance principles, and historical case studies led by GSOM faculty.

2. Asynchronous Field Execution: Mid-Week | Self-Paced.

Students step away from the screen and directly into their local marketplace or community to execute the weekly field practicum.

3. Peer Review & Portal Submission: Deadline: Friday Midnight.

Students upload their field logs and video reflections to the online portal, interacting with and assessing the findings of their global classmates.
